UNIFORM: These can be purchased from John Lewis in the Harlequin or the school shop in Bushey High Street. Group scarves and woggles can be purchased through the group at a cost of £8.50. Optional extra group T shirts are available and can be ordered through us at Colony meetings.

Prior to investiture, smart casual attire is appropriate. Investiture usually takes place a few weeks after the first meeting. Indoor shoes are required for Colony meetings and black shoes are required for outdoor parades and activities.

- SUBSCRIPTIONS: These are £30 per term, subject to review, and include the annual capitation fee which covers the cost of training and insurance. What is a beaver?

The beaver is a member of the rodent family. It has a thick coat of brown wool and fur. It is the oily fur on the top of its body that keeps the beaver waterproof. The two front paws are similar to human hands and have five toes. The hind feet are webbed to help with swimming. The beaver uses its wide, flat tail as a rudder when swimming. It also uses its tail to slap the water or ground to warn others to return to the safety of the lodge. Its long sharp orange-coloured incisor teeth are capable of gnawing down trees. On land the beaver can walk on its hind legs and carry logs, mud or stones with its front paws. Beaver babies are called kits.

Where are beavers found?

Today the beaver can be found in parts of North America, Scandinavia and Eastern Europe. Beavers inhabited the British Isles until the twelfth century. Now beavers can only be found in captivity in the British Isles.

Where do beavers live?

Beavers live in lodges which are mounds of sticks, moss and stones with domed shaped roofs plastered with mud. The lodge has 2 entrances, both of which are under water. To keep these entrances under water, beavers build dams to raise the water level. Sometimes these can be as much as 100 metres long.
